

Diabetes Philippines Holds a Foot Summit

The treatment of the diabetic foot is complex and requires a multi-disciplinary approach to its proper management. In line with its objective to #EducateAdvocate, Diabetes Philippines (DP) conducted a foot summit attended by 140 physician-delegates last April 19-20, 2024: "The Arch and Sole. Putting the Spotlight on the Diabetic Foot."



Pathophysiology and assessment of the diabetic foot, offloading footwear, PAD, neuropathy and adjunctive treatment of the diabetic foot were discussed by experts from the fields of diabetology, endocrinology, surgery and vascular medicine. The lectures given by nurse specialists on foot care included proper nail care and the ABCs of wound dressing.

The goal of DP is for local chapters to cascade the event nationwide.

Western Sydney Diabetes Celebrates 10 Years of Impactful Action and Plans for the Future

Western Sydney Diabetes (WSD), a collaborative initiative led by the Western Sydney Local Health District and Western Sydney Primary Health Network, was established in 2014 to ease the burden of diabetes in Western Sydney, which experiences some of the highest rates of disease in the country.

On July 24, WSD marked a significant milestone with its 10-year anniversary celebration, held at The Blacktown Workers club. This event not only commemorated a decade of vital work in combating diabetes but also set the stage for future initiatives. The celebration was chaired by the renowned physician journalist Dr. Norman Swan of the ABC and local community leader Dr. Jim Taggart, who facilitated discussions on advancements in awareness, prevention, detection, and management of type 2 diabetes in the Western Sydney area.

Professor Glen Maberly, a leading figure in the initiative, reflected on the journey of WSD. "The WSD 10-year celebration has been a defining event in our journey, showcasing our achievements and setting a strong foundation for future success," said Prof. Maberly. He emphasized that the event was a crucial opportunity to reflect on past successes, recognize key contributors, and strategize for the future.

Over 200 attendees including doctors, nurses, community leaders, academics, and politicians came together to support the next phase of the **"beat diabetes together" campaign**. Prof. Maberly assured that the focus going forward would be on enhancing diabetes care, advocating for patient needs, and fostering a collaborative community dedicated to combating the disease. "Building on the momentum from the celebration, we will continue to engage with stakeholders, leveraging their support for ongoing and new initiatives," he stated.

A highlight of the event was the active participation of WSD's Alliance partners, who hosted booths and shared their contributions to the fight against diabetes. Among the partners, Morgan Stewart, CEO of Workers Lifestyle Group, expressed pride in hosting the event. "The success of Western Sydney Diabetes has been in its work in primary prevention by harnessing public and private voices and resources," Mr. Stewart noted. He also highlighted the 2kg Challenge, a successful campaign

rolled out to 27 local GP practices during diabetes week, aimed at reducing the risk of type 2 diabetes by encouraging participants to lose weight and maintain it.

As WSD continues to innovate and contribute to diabetes research, the commitment to improving patient outcomes and enhancing quality of life remains stronger than ever. The community and its leaders are ready to tackle the challenges ahead, armed with experience, achievements, and a robust network of support.




Advocacy Frontline in Australia

Parliamentary Diabetes Enquiry and Advocacy for Diabetes Care in Australia

Recently there has been much activity regarding diabetes assessment and advocacy in Australia. In July 2024 the Australian Parliamentary Inquiry into the State of Diabetes in the country was released, which received hundreds of submissions from lay and professional individuals and groups, including Diabetes Australia and the Australian Diabetes Society and industry. This 270 page document is available for free download.

The summary of 23 major recommendations included expanded access to continuous glucose monitoring, insulin pumps GLP-1 RA drugs and bariatic surgery, better food labelling, with less marketing of unhealthy food to children and consideration of a sugar tax. Expanded mental health support for youth with diabetes and types of appointments for people with diabetes living in rural and remote regions, and improved diabetes related data collection and usage were also recommended.



Released in July 2024 was a report from an Automated Insulin Delivery (AID) access summit meeting including many Australians living with Type 1 diabetes, diabetes health care professionals and representatives of many diabetes related organisations. Even though Continuous Glucose Monitors (CGMs) and insulin pump reservoirs and insulin delivery lines are Government subsidised, less than 20% of Australians with Type 1 diabetes can afford to use an AID system. An AID system includes an insulin pump with a continuous glucose monitor (CGM) linked with a computer program built into the pump or its controller which can automatically adjust insulin delivery minute by minute to suit the person's glucose levels. AID systems improve glucose levels and quality of life and reduce mental burden and complications and are cost-effective. Three key requests by the group were for ACCESS, irrespective of age, geography of financial means; CHOICE of which systems best fits the individual, and a STAGED IMPLEMENTATION strategy for AID access to minimise issues related to product supply and healthcare professional workforce training and resources. The report is available free from here.
