## Rationale/Background

Kids and Diabetes in Schools (KiDS) is an International Diabetes Federation (IDF) programme that brings diabetes education to schools to fight **diabetes-related stigma and promote healthy lifestyles** to tackle the **preventable risk factors** for type 2 diabetes, in line with the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals. The programme was initiated by IDF, the International Society for Pediatric and Adolescent Diabetes (ISPAD) and Sanofi in 2013.

KiDS focuses on education, awareness and advocacy, with a long-term vision to build sustainable change and to drive as many countries as possible to include diabetes education in school curricula. Over the past decade, the programme was implemented in a structured format in 14 countries, reaching more than 340,000 students and 19,800 teachers in 2,100 schools.

During this webinar, we will celebrate a decade of success and reaffirm IDF's commitment to contributing to the well-being of children and adolescents with diabetes and preventing type 2 diabetes. The panel will include expert speakers from IDF, ISPAD, Sanofi and regional governments.
